A Presbyterian tradition for almost seventy years, the Christmas Joy Offering is one of the four special offerings designated by the General Assembly of the Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.) to provide congregations direct ways of supporting specific causes that help those in need. Fifty percent of the receipts to the Christmas Joy Offering is distributed to the Board of Pensions for assistance programs that provide support to retired and active church workers and their spouses and families. The other fifty percent supports Presbyterian-related racial ethnic education through the National Ministries Division of the General Assembly Council.

Over the next few weeks, our congregation will hear more about how the Christmas Joy Offering is used with Minutes for Mission and bulletin inserts. One of our bulletin inserts will introduce you to a missionary couple, Charles and Vera Ainley. The Ainleys were a missionary couple, who relied on prayer when they found themselves facing unsolvable problems. When Charles died in the late '70s, Vera depended on income and housing supplements from the Board of Pensions, which are supported by the Christmas Joy Offering. Your gifts enable the Board to help those who faithfully serve the church.

How blessed we are and what a wonderful time of the year to remember those who have faithfully served, as well as, those who are striving to become equipped to serve. Please think prayerfully about supporting the Christmas Joy Offering with a special gift this holiday season. We will collect the offering at both services on Christmas Eve. ICM Christmas Store



Interfaith Caring Ministries (ICM) is a non-profit organization that has been helping people in our community who are in need since 1985. It is the leading faith-based resource in this area for family and individual support services during times of difficulty. Each year, WPC participates with the ICM Christmas Store to help spread the holiday spirit by collecting items for low income families. Last year the store provided gifts for approximately 990 children, and they anticipate a much greater need this year due to the economy.

You can get involved with this program by bringing unwrapped, new toys and gift items to church with you on December 13. ICM needs items for babies, older children, and even household items. Gifts for teens are always needed. Donations of wrapping paper, ribbon, tape, and gift cards would also be appreciated. The gifts will be collected in the Parlor after both services and delivered to the collection point.

In addition to bringing items to share, we have an opportunity to actively work at the Christmas Store helping parents select gifts for their children. The Store will be open at Clear Lake Presbyterian Church on December 14 - 16. Monday, December 14, is scheduled for set-up and inventory, and the hours will be from 10:00am to 5:00pm. This would be a great shift for all of our “hammer types”. On Tuesday and Wednesday the shifts are from 8:30am to 12:30pm and from 12:30pm to 4:30pm. This includes time for training before each shift. Each shift needs from 30 to 40 volunteers. Volunteers can work mornings, afternoons, all day, both afternoons, or any combination you desire.

There is nothing you will do this Christmas that is more rewarding or fulfilling than volunteering at the Christmas Store; it is a perfect opportunity for Covenant Groups, Bible Study Groups, or individuals to participate in sharing the love of Christ at Christmas. Have You Located the AEDs?

The Automated External Defibrillator is a machine with a computer inside. This device is placed on a person who has no pulse and is not breathing. One AED has been placed in a central location in each of the WPC buildings.

1. In the Narthex of the Sanctuary building near the fire extinguisher
2. Near Bouton Hall (by the stairs) in the Office/Education Building
3. In Wholy Grounds in the Fellowship building

The AEDs are in a red case located inside an alarmed, white metal cabinet. Please do not open the cabinets unless you truly need the AED for a cardiac arrest victim because the alarm will begin as soon as the door is opened.

The AED uses visual and audible prompts to tell the rescuer the steps to take. Giving CPR right away and using an AED within a few minutes will increase the chances of saving someone's life. Training is in process and you should watch the bulletins for a class you may attend.

where “myuserid” is your user ID and “mypassword” is your password. Make sure you get the ?'s and &'s right and remember, everything is case sensitive. This will make it so you don't have to type in your userid/password every time you go to use that feature.

The rest is obvious, you'll see a box where you enter a last name or part of a last name, and you'll get a list of people matching that name, then you click on one and see their information. Depending on your smart phone, you can click on the phone number or email address to call or email them directly.

"Mark"ings

In the eyes of our minds, we see the shepherds watching over their flocks by night, near Bethlehem. Perhaps it was a chilly night, and perhaps they had built a fire to keep warm. Perhaps they were standing near the fire, talking, holding onto their cloaks as the wind pulled at them. Suddenly there was someone else there with them. Somehow, he was not like them. Perhaps they knew he was an angel, but whatever they thought their first impulse was one of fear. So the angel said those words that seem to be so often needed in the Bible – **"Don't be afraid."** Then he said some of history's greatest, most profound and important words – **"I bring you good news of great joy that will be for all people. This day a Savior is born, the Messiah, the Lord."**

"Good news of great joy..." Those words give Christmas its meaning, and we sing them each year in the powerful carol, **"Joy to the World!"** Have we considered, though, what those words might actually mean? We believe they mean that salvation has come, and redemption, and the promise of eternal life. Surely, that is the greatest news any angel could ever bring. Still, they sound vaguely like good news of another world, a world to come. What about this world? Does the birth of the Messiah mean good news for this world, the world of the here and now?

When the Messiah grew up and began his work, he took as his mandate the words of the prophet Isaiah. **"The Spirit of the Lord is upon me,"** he said, **"because he has anointed me to bring good news to the poor, to proclaim release to the captives and recovery of sight to the blind, to let the oppressed go free."** What if he meant that literally? This world has crushed many with poverty and oppression. Many are prisoners in unjust prisons of many kinds. What if he meant that his work, and the work of those who follow him and claim his name, would be to bring food to the hungry of this world, sight to the blind and healing to the sick, and freedom to the imprisoned and oppressed, to oppose the powers of this world that crush and oppress? I think that is what he meant. God's will is the betterment of the lives of people, and working for that betterment is to be the work of the people of Christ, the church. Us.

Let us celebrate Christmas all year long by working to bring that good news to all people.

Notes from the Treasurer ...

Thank you to those who have fulfilled their 2009 pledges. Thank you to those who have given more than their pledges. Thank you to those who prepaid their 2009 pledges in 2008 and to all who have kept their pledges up to date throughout 2009. And a special thank you to those who have prepaid their 2010 pledges.

Remember, if you wish to transfer stock to the church for credit in 2009, you need to allow time for funds to clear – 5 business days. Call the treasurer immediately if you plan to transfer mutual funds as these require special treatment.

And for those of you who are 70 ½ years or older and are required to take a minimum distribution from your Individual Retirement Account, a tax law provision allows you to transfer part or all of the Required Minimum Distribution (RMD) directly to the church (limit \$100,000). You will not receive a Charitable Deduction, but you **won't pay taxes on the transferred funds. These funds may be used to satisfy your pledge or to support our designated missions.** Please talk with your financial advisor to determine if this is appropriate for you.

End of year information – checks or cash must be received in the office no later than December 31st to be included in your 2009 Charitable Tax Receipt. Mailed checks must be postmarked no later than December 31st. Please mark checks if designated for 2010 commitments. Thank you. Pat Koester 281-332-1251 Ext. 18
