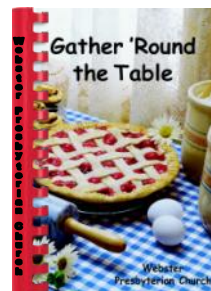

For those of you not familiar with Dinner Club 7 it is a small group Fellowship activity. Groups are established for a period of six months. Both couples and singles are welcome. "Mark"ings

For as long as I have been a Presbyterian minister, and that's more than thirty years now, the denomination has struggled with the matter of the ordination of people of homosexual orientation. For some people the answer seemed crystal clear, in one direction or another. Some saw certain biblical passages and didn't see how the church could possibly violate them. Others saw it as a justice issue, pointing out that the church once also found biblical justification for the repression of women and the support of slavery. For me, and there were many like me, it was a terribly troubling matter for which an easy answer seemed hard to come by. Mostly it seemed to bring along a lot of sadness as we watched vote after vote over the years continually tear our church apart.

For a few hundred years the Presbyterian Church in its various forms got by without any prohibition against the ordination of any particular classes of individuals. It depended upon the local church to determine who was "ordainable" as elders and deacons, and upon presbyteries to determine who was "ordainable" as ministers of the Word and Sacrament. Then, some years ago, the General Assembly passed and the presbyteries ratified a constitutional change stipulating "*fidelity in marriage and chastity in singleness*" as a qualification for ordination. On its surface it seemed fair and it seemed biblical. The church had defined a certain kind of sexual responsibility as a prerequisite for ordination. However, it was very clear from where that amendment to the Book of Order came. It was directed against gay and lesbian people whose only option was celibacy because they were given no opportunity to live in "fidelity in marriage."

After more years of struggle, last year our church's General Assembly voted to remove that amendment. Within recent weeks enough presbyteries had voted to ratify the move that it has, or soon will, become official. There is now no constitutional prohibition to prevent the ordination of anyone based on sexuality. This is as it should be.

Our church does have standards for ordination. The Book of Order will now say this:

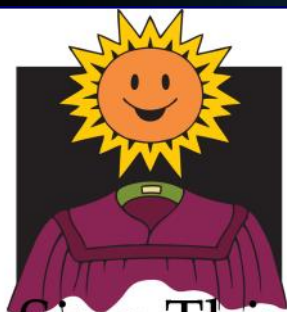
Standards for ordained service reflect the church's desire to submit joyfully to the Lordship of Jesus Christ in all aspects of life (G-1.0000). The governing body responsible for ordination and/or installation (G.14.0240; G-14.0450) shall examine each candidate's calling, gifts, preparation, and suitability for the responsibilities of office. The examination shall include, but not be limited to, a determination of the candidate's ability and commitment to fulfill all requirements as expressed in the constitutional questions for ordination and installation (W-4.4003). Governing bodies shall be guided by Scripture and the confessions in applying standards to individual candidates.

This move returns us to our historic position of depending upon those who know the candidates best, local churches and presbyteries, to decide who should or should not be ordained. It also removes us from the hypocritical position of saying that, while we have all fallen short of what God intends for us, there are certain people who fall so far short that we will not even allow them to serve the church in ordained office. Does anyone think sexual sins are the sins God is most concerned with? If not, why do we allow ourselves to be content with such a short list of those excluded from ordained service?

This will not end the fighting over this matter. Some of those who oppose this move will now decide it is finally time to leave the denomination. Others will decide to stay and continue to fight, bringing more overtures to the General Assembly to reintroduce language into the Book of Order to once again prohibit the ordination of people of certain orientations. We should resist those efforts. We should continue our historic reliance on the Holy Spirit to call people to office and to lead local churches and presbyteries to validate those calls through their votes. A central position of Presbyterianism is that God speaks through the voice of God's people, and that we can see how God has led the church as we look back over its history. Let us now affirm and acknowledge God's leadership through years of struggle. Let us earnestly pray for the PC (USA). Let us prayerfully consider how God is leading our congregation. And let us rejoice.

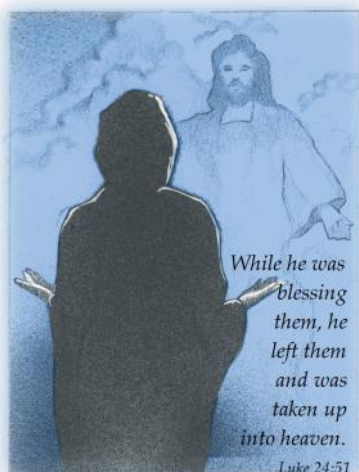


Sing This Summer!

Covenant Group News

We now have 8 Covenant Groups at WPC, having added 2 more this past year. Some have been meeting for as long as 6 years. However, I occasionally hear someone ask: "Well, what is a Covenant Group?"

So for those that are new or still wonder, here is my answer: Covenant Groups are what we have named our Small Group Ministry. They are groups of 6 to 12 members that meet weekly, monthly, or twice monthly usually in someone's home. The groups are made up of men, women, and couples from our larger community of faith.

Why do we call these Covenant Groups? Because each member makes a covenant to deepen their relationship with God through sharing, caring, and praying for one another. The groups begin by studying the "One Anothering" series by Richard Meyer, a Presbyterian pastor who has dedicated his life to small group ministry. Then the groups choose new books, readings, or videos, to use as a springboard for personal sharing and spiritual growth.

Members share the joys, the fun and the "funnies" in their lives, as well as the concerns and sorrows. They support each other in each person's Christian journey. They learn to handle differences without hurting or having to win. And, most important, they pray for one another. Group members have said they feel KNOWN and LOVED. What greater gift can we give one another?

Groups have been open to receiving new members, and some members have moved on to other ministries. Even though some groups have been together a long time, new members are made to feel welcome and included. One of our newest groups is made up of parents who meet twice monthly at the church on Wednesday evenings when child care is provided. The newest group meets monthly in the Pearland area. Both of these would welcome new members. Perhaps this coming fall, we will have enough people interested to start another new group.
